Legislative:

- Corporate Transparency Act update: FINCEN (Financial Crimes Enforcement Network) announced that Beneficial Ownership Information (BOI) Reporting is BACK in effect as of February 19, 2025. The new deadline for completing your BOI is March 21, 2025. Unreported BOI comes with heavy fines so it is recommended to complete the filing as soon as possible. You can learn more [here](#).
- Yamhill County elected officials at the Federal level are [Congresswoman Andrea Salinas](#), [Senator Ron Wyden](#) and [Senator Jeff Merkley](#) and the Oregon State legislature are [Senator Bruce Starr](#), [Representative Anna Scharf](#) and [Representative Lucetta Elmer](#).
- The [SEC](#) is looking into how to make it easier for small companies to raise capital. The Regulation Crowdfunding was adopted by the SEC in 2012 as part of the Jobs Act. The RegCF was designed to make it less costly for startup companies. You can read an article about it [here](#).
- The IRS is continuing to offer tools for businesses such as sole props, individual shareholders of S Corps and C corps. You can check to see if you are eligible to use the [Business Tax Account](#) to access tax information and meet tax obligations. On the site you can check your balance due; payment history; authorize requests from a lender submitted through Income Verification Express Service; transcripts of your tax return; digital copies of select IRS notices; business name and address on file; tax compliance report for award use. - You can file for free with the IRS. The [IRS Free File](#) adjusted gross income for tax year 2024 is \$84,000 for families and individuals. If you don't qualify, you can still use [free fillable forms](#).
- Congress is considering tax breaks such as overtime, tips, and car loan interest. The largest being considered is the tax on overtime pay. You can read an article [here](#) about it.

- Yamhill County Commissioners approved a Rural Industrial Tax Exemption. The application for the RITE and the ordinance is attached for you. Please let me know if you have any questions. If you would like more information on this program, please email goodrumg@yamhillcounty.gov.

- In the short-term, interest rates are likely not to come down, which could mean that borrowing rates will remain high, and investment rates in CD’s and high yield savings account could also remain high. There are [predictions](#) that the Federal Reserve may lower the prime rate later in the year. Their next meeting is March 18-19, a meeting associated with a Summary of Economic Projections.
