Board of Commissioners,

We are applying for an Outdoor Mass Gathering Permit. We would like to hold rodeos on a friend's property in Carlton, Oregon. We have conducted rodeos in past years which has helped us to improve our events because we have learned what additional things we can do so the people attending the rodeo will have a safe, healthy, and happy experience. Our rodeos are meant for entire families to enjoy so we have activities for children as well, including a bouncy house, face painting, and some vendor booths.

The property is located at 8795 Mineral Springs Road. The size of the lot is 14 acres. Signage will be located at varying spots on Mineral Springs Road to guide attendees to the place of the event. Event personnel are located at the entrance to the property to direct traffic onto the property. Event personnel are located within the parking area to direct cars to the appropriate parking spaces. The parking area is roped off to keep cars away from pedestrians and the rodeo events.

No permanent structures will be built on the property for the rodeo. No alterations will be made to the property. All structures will be temporary. Structures include bleachers for the arena events, a flat bed trailer to use as a stage for the bands, pop-up tents in the areas where food and beverages are served as well as serving tables, and picnic tables with umbrellas. All debris, residue, and temporary structures will be removed within 72 hours after the event has taken place.

There will be at least ten food items served. The food handlers are all experienced restaurant waiters and waitresses so they are familiar with food safety. There is a wash station near the food service area for the food handlers. Beverages will also be served, including bottled water, pop, and beer. There are alcohol managers with service permits from the OLCC on duty. An OLCC permit will be obtained for the serving of alcohol for this specific event.

Twenty chemical toilets will be provided. Trash cans will be placed throughout the area. Security personnel will be stationed at the entrance and will be available in all areas. An ambulance and medical personnel will be on site. The event takes place on bare ground thereby minimizing a fire hazard. Piped in water is available to spray down the dirt in the arena area or for any other needs. The arena is bordered with metal fencing.

The bulls are transported by commercial vehicles. They are given food and water during the day. The bull riders are professionals. In addition to the bulls, show horses are also featured. The show horses are horses brought by individuals to "dance" and show off their tricks. Bleachers are located around one-half of the arena for spectator seating. The arena is bordered by metal fencing, similar to what they use at the Yamhill County Fairgrounds for their rodeos. When the bulls and horses are not in the arena, they are housed behind the arena, corralled by metal fencing.

We appreciate this opportunity to bring this event to the Carlton area and to provide the citizens of Yamhill County with a family day of fun and entertainment. We intend to provide a portion of the proceeds to the local community in order to give back to the community.



Mary and I starting discussing some of the differences earlier today. I have gone ahead and attached a copy of Ordinance 580 and this particular Mass Gathering Application. The public hearing is scheduled for next Thursday, August 6, 2015. The applicant is RBRK, Inc, through Miguel A. Garcia Negrete, and the property owner is Brian Myrick.

As Mike points out, the notice requirements under our Mass Gathering Ordinance are different. We publish one time in a local paper (this time its the News Register) and there is no direct notice provided to the neighbors; however, I do believe that in this particular instance Ken Friday did mention the upcoming public hearing to at least one of the neighbors (Steve Caldwell).

Ordinance 580 limits the number of events to 5 in any single calendar year. While events can exceed 24 hours, each 24 hour period is considered one event. So, for example, a 3-day music festival would be considered 3 events.

There are additional requirements for gatherings where more than 3,000 persons are expected.

Section 6 allows the Board to consider at a single hearing an application for up to 5 separate events on a single parcel. This application is for 3 separate events on 8/30/15, 9/13/15 and 9/27/15 on the same parcel. At the Board's discretion, you can grant permission for the first event with permission for remaining events subject to revocation as provided in the permit.

Let me know if there are other questions or if you would like to discuss this further prior to next week's hearing.

Commissioners,

Because mass gathering permits are not processed as land use applications, I have not typically made comments regarding any such applications, except to say no comment. Likewise, in the case of RBRK's application for a mass gathering permit, I am not making comments with regard to the merits of the application. Again, this is not a land use application and it is outside the scope of the planning department. Having said that, I want to provide you with some

background information which may be useful to you as you review this application and particularly as you take testimony during the upcoming public hearing on this matter.

In August 2012, RBRK, Inc. (Miguel Garcia) applied for a one day event under the agri-tourism event provisions of the Yamhill County Zoning Ordinance, Section 1013(A)(2). The application was approved by the planning director for an outdoor rodeo event to be held on September 16, 2012 (see attached letter of approval dated August 31, 2012 for Docket E-02-12). The approval included 7 conditions including hours of operation, the number of attendees, etc. Notice of that approval was sent to surrounding property owners and published in the local newspaper. No one appealed that approval and the event took place as scheduled. However, following the event the planning department did receive a complaint regarding exceeding the hours of operation, midnight, and possibly exceeding the maximum number of vehicles allowed at the event, 250.

In the spring of 2013, Mr. Garcia again made an event application with the planning department. This time, the application was for 18 events, the maximum allowed under Section 1013 of the zoning ordinance. Subsequently, the application was amended to 6 events because that was the maximum number of events Mr. Garcia planned to hold in a calendar year. In June 2013, the planning director approved the application for 6 events with conditions (Docket E-04-13). That decision was then appealed to the Board of Commissioners. After holding a public hearing and leaving the record open for additional testimony to be received, the Board of Commissioners unanimously denied the appeal and approved the application for up to 6 events in a calendar year (See Board Order 13-539 attached). That approval included conditions on the maximum number of attendees (500), etc. Condition #14 required that the approval would expire in one year from August 29, 2013. That condition allowed the applicant to renew the approval for 6 annual events subject to submitting a renewal application and subject to satisfying the other conditions of approval.

For whatever reason, the applicant did not apply to renew the original approval within the one year period ending on August 29, 2014. Instead, a new application to hold multiple rodeo events was submitted in April 2015. Public notice was provided to surrounding property owners and as a result of that notice a request for a hearing before the planning commission was made. That request for hearing was made by the individual who had complained about the original rodeo event in 2012 and who also appealed the 2013 planning director approval to the Board. In addition, several letters in opposition to the event application were received from others.

In preparation for the planning commission hearing, planning staff sent a letter to the applicant, RBRK, Inc., requesting that additional information be submitted. Among the information requested by staff was demonstration that the conditions from the previous agri-tourism event approval were complied with. It was at this time that planning staff became aware that the events held in 2013 may have had more than 1,000 attendees rather than the 500 allowed by the Board approval. At this point, the applicant was informed that perhaps he should look into a mass gathering application because of the potential number of attendees.

In conclusion, please be advised that the event application filed with the planning department is on hold pending the decision on the mass gathering application. It is my understanding that, if the mass gathering permit is approved, the land use application for events will be withdrawn. If that is the case, the planning department would refund the filing fee for the hearing request made by a neighboring property owner. On the other hand, if the mass gathering permit is denied, I believe that the land use application would be heard before the planning commission and ultimately before the Board on appeal. In other words, one way or the other the proposed rodeo events will be coming before the Board. Finally, please remember that the criteria for a mass gathering permit are substantially different than for an event permit which is processed under the zoning ordinance. Legal counsel can instruct you as to those differences.
