THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF YAMHILL COUNTY ("the Board") sat for the transaction of county business in formal session on July 20, 2017, at 10:00 a.m. in Room 32 of the courthouse, Commissioners Mary Starrett, Stan Primozych, and Richard L. "Rick" Olson being present.

Also present were Laura Tschabold, County Administrator; Todd Sadlo, Senior Assistant County Counsel; and Mikalie Frei, County Counsel staff.

Commissioner Primozych called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. The invocation was offered Matthew Cooksey, member of Valley Baptist Church.

Subj: Rule of Law

Recent news reports tell us that the Veterans Administration(VA) has fired more than 500 employees and suspended another 200.

I am proud to say that I am a veteran who took an oath many, many years ago to support and defend against all enemies foreign and domestic. Most of us understand who a foreign enemy is but there is a lot of confusion about - who is a domestic enemy.

My understanding of - who is a domestic enemy - is anyone who actively usurps the rule of laws established by God, the United States Constitution, the Bill of Rights, the individual State laws, and other lawfully established rules of conduct.

Here in Yamhill County the elected officers and some appointed employees have chosen to ignore the oath as mandated in the Oregon Constitution. The Oregon Constitution provides for prosecution of those who have not, nor will not, follow the laws provided for lawful government.

June 30 (ORS 309.110 (5) was the deadline for the Board of Property Tax Appeals (BOPTA, BPTA) to amend any or all of their decisions of the 2016-2017 sessions. As of this day, my Petition No. 4 has not been amended. Consequently, the violations of established law by BOPTA and others remain in place as sustained by BOPTA.

I have a copy of Petition No. 4 that I will give to Commissioner Olson who is liaison to BOPTA and another binder that shows County Counselor, Christian Boenisch has responsibilities as appointed counsel for BOPTA.

My grievances and petitions for redress these past 15 years have not been resolved in accordance with existing laws.

This Board of Commissioners have the authority to issue a Board Order as requested by me during past Formal Meetings. Its past time to govern in compliance with existing laws.
