

AMENDMENT NO. 1
AGREEMENT FOR MEDICATION ASSISTED TREATMENT SERVICES
YAMHILL COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE AND CRC HEALTH OREGON, LLC

THIS AMENDMENT NO. 1 ("Amendment #1") shall be made effective as of the last date set forth adjacent to the signatures of the parties below, between Yamhill County, a political subdivision of the State of Oregon acting by and through its Board of Commissioners and its Yamhill County Sheriff's Office ("County") and CRC Health Oregon, LLC, an Oregon limited liability company, doing business locally as Willamette Valley Treatment Center, 1160 Liberty SE, Salem OR 97302. ("Contractor"), referred to individually as Party and collectively as Parties.

RECITALS

1. County and Contractor are parties to that certain agreement dated May 10, 2018 (the "Underlying Agreement"), pursuant to which Contractor supports Yamhill County in providing additional treatment options and services to inmates in YCCF with Opioid Use Disorder (OUD), including providing Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) for OUD to YCCF inmates. The Underlying Agreement is memorialized in Yamhill County records as Board Order 18-140.
2. County and Contractor now desires to modify the Underlying Agreement upon the terms and conditions more particularly set forth herein below.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements set forth herein below and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. Section 1 of the Underlying Agreement is hereby amended to extend the term of the Underlying Agreement from May 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. It is understood by both parties that no commitments have been or are made by either party beyond the termination of this Agreement.
2. Section 6, Item B, is amended to increase the not-to-exceed amount payable for performance of Services under the Agreement for the period April 1, 2018 through June 30, 2020 to \$589,400.01. Except as amended herein the balance of Section 6, Item B remains unchanged.
3. Section 7, Item A, is amended to read "Either party may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause, upon 90 days prior written notice to the other party." Except as amended herein the balance of Section 7, Item A remains unchanged.
4. Exhibit B, Statement of Work is amended as follows: new language is **bold and underlined**; deleted language is ~~struck through~~:

"Treatment Planning: The Treatment Team will develop a Treatment Plan geared to the needs of the inmate, including the selected MAT, and will be

updated frequently during the next 90 days to reflect the changing treatment and recovery support needs of the inmate/ex offender. This will take place during incarceration and post-release at Willamette Valley Treatment Center (in Phase I) or the satellite treatment site (in Phase II). Part of the Treatment plan will be a transition plan to guide release and immediate post-release supports, ~~and will include at least one session with the Certified Recovery Mentor.~~

Recovery Support: Patients enter the community with multiple needs that must be addressed to increase their chances of success. In addition to substance abuse disorders parolees may need assistance with housing, education, employment, transportation, family issues, and medical and mental health problems. The CADC Counselor or Recovery Mentor will identify and prioritize clients' needs, coordinate clients' drug treatment with services from other agencies, and follow up on client progress, subject to release-of-information agreements. ~~CRM support will continue as long as the individual is in treatment.~~

**Rate Information specific to the period of the Underlying Agreement
EFFECTIVE 5/1/19-7/30/20**

- **Weekly rate of ~~\$377.67~~ \$300.00 per patient (based on the monthly quote we provided, divided by 14 patients per month. An additional ~~\$377.67~~ \$300.00 will be charged or each inmate over the census of 14).**

Except as amended herein, Exhibit B, Statement of Work of the Underlying Agreement remains unchanged.


5. **Ratification.** Except as otherwise expressly modified by the terms of this Amendment #1, the Underlying Agreement shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect. All terms, covenants, and conditions of the Underlying Agreement not expressly modified herein are hereby confirmed and ratified and remain in full force and effect and constitute valid and binding obligations of County and Contractor enforceable according to the terms thereof.
6. **Authority.** County and Contractor and each of the persons executing this Amendment #1 on behalf of County and Contractor hereby covenants and warrants that: (i) such party has full right and authority to enter into this Amendment #1 and has taken all action required to authorize such party (and each person executing this Amendment #1 on behalf of such party) to enter into this Amendment #1, and (ii) the person signing on behalf of such party is authorized to do so on behalf of such entity.
7. **Binding Effect.** All of the covenants contained in this Amendment #1 shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, legal representatives, and permitted successors and assigns.


