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RESOLUTION 21-04-15-1

WHEREAS, over 150,000 Oregonians are directly harmed by crime each year, and the physical, emotional, and financial impact of crime falls on people of all ages and abilities, who come from all economic, racial, and social backgrounds; and these crimes affect many more family members, friends, neighbors, and coworkers; and,

WHEREAS, victims who feel understood and supported are more likely to disclose their victimization, seek services, and participate in the justice process; and,

WHEREAS, providing victims with knowledge of their rights and available services further strengthens their ability to recover by restoring a sense of self-empowerment; and,

WHEREAS, a trauma-informed response to victims promotes healing and fosters strength in survivors; and,

WHEREAS, we celebrate those who provide help and support to child victims of violence and sexual abuse; stalking victims; survivors of homicide victims; victims of drunk-driving crashes; and victims of domestic, dating, and sexual violence, and many other life altering crimes and their commitment to respect and enforce victims' rights and to address their needs; and,

WHEREAS, National Crime Victims' Rights Week provides an opportunity to recommit and ensuring that all victims of crime are afforded their rights; and,

WHEREAS, Yamhill County is hereby dedicated to strengthening victims and survivors in the aftermath of crime, building resilience in our communities and our victim responders, and working for justice for all victims and survivors; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Yamhill County Board of Commissioners do hereby proclaim the week of April 18-24, 2021 as:

NATIONAL CRIME VICTIMS' RIGHTS WEEK
