Dear Mr. Allen,

For the past year and a half, there have been concerns about the information you have shared in your role as Director of the Oregon Health Authority, including your statement during a meeting of county commissioners last year that the COVID-19 vaccines were "FDA approved". When challenged, you stood by that statement.

What is concerning, is that questionable information continues, most recently, in your letter of September 3, 2021, where you wrote:

Infected persons can shed large quantities of the virus for two days before symptoms appear. Persons without symptoms are estimated to account for more than 50% of SARS-CoV-2 transmissions...

Would you please provide your empirical evidence showing that to be the case?

Data to that effect has not been published by OHA.

In addition, please review the data cited below and the conclusions reached using OHA's own data:

Up To 47.3% of August COVID Deaths in Oregon (at the very least 24.3%) Were Due to Vaccine Breakthrough (Vaccine Failure).

The following analysis will compare data for vaccine breakthrough, otherwise known as vaccine failure, to date for COVID cases, hospitalizations, and deaths as reported by the Oregon Health Authority for the month of August.

B.O. 21-379

The Oregon Health Authority began reporting vaccine breakthrough data on May 3rd, 2021, almost 5 months after the first emergency use authorizations were approved for the experimental COVID vaccines.

Vaccine Breakthrough Data as Reported by The Oregon Health Authority:

What This Means During July 31 to August 28:

1. There were 71 COVID related deaths in the fully vaccinated as defined by the special rules the CDC put in place as to what constitutes a vaccine failure (breakthrough case).

In this same period, there were 292 deaths attributed to COVID. This means that at least 24.3% of deaths were due to vaccine failure.

2. There were 349 hospitalizations for vaccine breakthrough. In this same time period, there were 2,469 hospitalizations. This means that at least 14.1% of hospitalizations were due to vaccine failure.

3. There were 8,970 cases for vaccine breakthrough. In this same period, there were 52,097 new cases, how many of which we have no idea as to whether or not they were false positives because the PCR cycle threshold value was above 28. (Oregon Senator Linthicum has requested the PCR cycle threshold data and his legally valid request for records has been denied by the OHA). This means that at least 17.1% of cases were due to vaccine failure.

The question, Mr. Allen is:

'Are vaccine breakthrough deaths being included in the total death report?'

The answer to this is yes.

So, then 71 of these 292 deaths are from the vaccine failing to prevent the infection. However, these 71 breakthrough deaths may not include residents of senior assisted living centers (SALCs). The OHA confirms that as of August 29, 2021 there have been 512 vaccine breakthrough cases in SALCs. When we compare this to the 278 vaccine breakthrough cases in SALCs as of July 1, 2021, we can see that there were approximately 234 new breakthrough cases in SALCs during August.

So, let's look at SALC data from 8.1.2021 to 8.29.2021...

8.1 - 1,374 deaths

This is an increase of 67 deaths over the month of August...it's a virtual guarantee that all of these were vaccinated...the question becomes "is the OHA is counting SALC deaths as COVID caused and not vaccine breakthrough?"

Currently the answer to this question is not being made clear by the OHA.

If the OHA is not including fully vaccinated SALC deaths as breakthrough deaths, then this could mean that during August there were $(71+67 = 138)$ vaccine breakthrough deaths and that the overall total could be $(113+117 = 230)$ since May 1st.

So, then we go a little deeper and according to the CDC the only people who qualify for vaccine breakthrough must meet the following criteria:

- Have received both Pfizer, both Moderna/NIH, or 1 J&J AND
- Be at least 14 day post final shot in series AND
- Have a PCR Cycle threshold below 28

CONCLUSIONS:

It is reasonable to assert that from July 1st to August 29 in the state of Oregon 138 of 292 deaths attributed to COVID were among the fully vaccinated. This calculates to 47.3% of all COVID deaths in Oregon were due to vaccine failure during the month of August.

It is impossible to state that something with a 47.3% failure rate is effective.

When this is coupled with the fact that at least 63 Oregonians have died post-inoculation and that the standard for terminating clinical trials is one death, it is impossible to assert that these experimental inoculations still in clinical trial until October 27, 2022 (Moderna/NIH), January 2, 2023 (Johnson & Johnson), May 2, 2023 (Pfizer/BioNTech) are safe.
