Hi Mary and Ken,

Attached is amendment #5 to our agreement with the Oregon Health Authority for the financing of Community Mental Health, Addiction Treatment, Recovery, & Prevention, and Problem Gambling Services (BO 21-490). The amendment adds \$62,885.59 retroactive from January 1, 2023, through June 30, 2023. While all of this funding is not included in our Health and Human Services 2022-2023 Adopted Budget, we have sufficient budget authority.

The amendment reconciles funding amounts from previous amendments and includes \$299,813 for Crisis Services. This additional funding along with funding from the Yamhill Community Care Organization (YCCO), will allow us to add additional members to our Crisis team to respond to the needs of our community members 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. Considering this, we would like to request the following changes to the current position management authority within the HHS Adult Behavioral Health Division (Div. 174):

- Add 1.0 FTE Program Manager 1 (40137) for a Crisis Supervisor
- Add 5.0 FTE HS Spec 3 (40624) for Mobile Crisis QMHPs
- Add 0.5 FTE HS Spec 3 (40624) to bring the Aid & Assist QMHP position from 0.5 FTE to 1.0 FTE

I recommend the Board approve this amendment as written and approve changes to the current position management authority. Please let me know if you have any questions.
