ORDINANCE No. 60

WHEREAS, according to ORS 167.119, "Counties and cities may, by ordinance, prohibit, regulate, limit or license the playing or conducting of a social game", and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Yamhill County have determined that limited social games should be allowed in Yamhill County.

THE YAMHILL COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

That Social games as defined in ORS 167.117 are hereby permitted in Yamhill County in private businesses, private clubs, or places of public accomodation, where no house player, house bank or house odds exist and there is no house income from the operation of the social game.

THE BOARD FURTHER ORDAINS that, This Ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist and this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage by the Board.

ORDINANCE NO. 3703

An Ordinance regulating and authorizing social games in accordance with Oregon Revised Statutes, and declaring an emergency.

The City of McMinnville Ordains as Follows:

Section 1. That the playing or conducting of a social game in a private business, private club or in a place of public accommodation where no house player, house bank, or house odds exist and there is no house income from the operation of the social game, is authorized in accordance with the provisions of ORS Chapter 167.117 to 167.162 and Chapter 7 of the Oregon Legislative Assembly 1974 Special Session Laws.

Section 2. This Ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist and this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
