ORDINANCE NO. 188

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of Yamhill County, Oregon, (the Board) on the 22nd day of November, 1978, sat for the transaction of County business, in regular session, Commissioners John P. Macaulay, Colin Armstrong and Ted Lopuszynski being present.

WHEREAS, the Board on the 22nd day of November, 1978, held a public hearing on a request by the Dog Control Advisory Committee to increase the Late License Fee of the Dog Control Ordinance No.150 to \$25.00, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners after public hearing and first reading on November 22nd, 1978, and after the declaration of the existence of an emergency, for the Yamhill County Board of Commissioners, voted to approve the request by the Dog Control Advisory Committee, NOW THEREFORE,

IT IS HEREBY URDAINED that the Yamhill County Dog Control Ordinance No.150 be and hereby is amended as follows:

1. Paragraph 4.4 of Ordinance No.150 is amended to read as follows:

"4.4 LATE LICENSE FEE Any Owner or keeper of a dog who fails to procure or pay for a license within the time limits required by this Ordinance in any year shall pay a delinquent payment for such a failure in the sum of \$25.00 for each dog, provided that, in the case of a kennel, the failure to procure a valid license as required shall subject that kennel to a delinquent license fee of \$10.00 for each dog on the premises at the date of the violation, if said dogs are not otherwise exempt from this Ordinance. Such fee shall be in addition to the regular license fees and shall be paid at the time of the issuance of the license or licenses."
2. Except as expressly amended herein, Ordinance No. 150 shall remain in full force and effect.
3. This amendment to the Dog Control Ordinance No.150, being necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the people of Yamhill County and the Board having declared an emergency to exist, said amendment shall be effective upon the approval hereof.
