THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF YAMHILL COUNTY, OREGON ("the Board") sat for the transaction of county business in formal session on December 13, 2001, commissioners Thomas E.E. Bunn, Robert Johnstone, and Leslie Lewis being present.

THE BOARD MAKES THE FOLLOWING FINDINGS:

- A. All current members of the Yamhill County Dog Control Advisory Board have terms to expire December 31, 2001.
- B. It is in the interest of the people of Yamhill County to have meaningful public input and participation on matters of dog control. The following changes to the dog control ordinance should be adopted. NOW, THEREFORE,

THE YAMHILL COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Effective immediately, Section 3 of the Yamhill County Dog Control Ordinance No. 692 is amended to read in its entirety as follows:

SECTION 3

ADVISORY COMMITTEE

3.1 DOG CONTROL ADVISORY COMMITTEE. There shall be a Dog Control Advisory Committee which shall consist of five residents of Yamhill County. At least one member of the committee shall reside within a city in Yamhill County; at least one member shall be directly connected with dogs; at least one member shall be selected from the unincorporated areas of the county; and at least two members shall be directly connected with the agriculture industry. The members shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Commissioners, without pay. Members of the committee shall serve for two years or until replaced by the Board. Members of the committee shall select from their number a chairman who shall preside at all meetings and a secretary who shall keep the minutes of the meetings and other proceedings. A quorum for the transaction of business shall consist of three

members. The committee shall meet upon the call of the chairman or upon the call of any three members. Regularly scheduled meetings may be established in the discretion of the committee. The terms shall be staggered. Thus, the two members appointed effective January 1, 2002 will have 1 year terms, while the other 3 appointed will have 2 year terms. Except for those appointed January 1, 2002, terms of members will be 2 years. The Board may appoint dog control advisory committee members to as many terms as the Board determines appropriate.

3.2 POWERS OF THE DOG CONTROL ADVISORY COMMITTEE. The Dog Control Advisory Committee may review all claims against the Dog Control Fund for livestock killed by a dog, and may make general policy recommendations to the Board of Commissioners concerning the amounts to be paid upon such claims. The committee may, as it deems necessary, advise the Board on matters related to Dog Control .

Section 2. This ordinance being necessary for the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Yamhill County, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance is effective upon passage.


