THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF YAMHILL COUNTY, OREGON ("the Board") sat for the transaction of county business in special session on March 10, 1993, Commissioners Debi Owens, Dennis L. Goecks and Ted Lopuszynski.

THE BOARD makes the following findings in support of adoption of this ordinance:

1. With the concurrence of Monrovia Nurseries, Inc. ("Monrovia"), the county has withdrawn its application to the Oregon Economic Development Department ("OEDD") for a grant and loan from Oregon Lottery Funds available as "Special Public Works Funds" to help finance the construction of certain road improvements on the Lafayette-Hopewell Highway.

2. On October 28, 1992 the Board adopted Ordinance 540, which allowed Ted Lopuszynski, Chairman, Yamhill County Board of Commissioners, acting in his official capacity, to sign the "State of Oregon Special Public Works Fund Financial Assistance Award Contract" and "Loan Agreement" between the Oregon Economic Development Department and Yamhill County (Contract L92011). Yamhill County never executed the "Financial Assistance Award Contract" or the "Loan Agreement."

3. It is necessary to repeal Ordinance 540. NOW, THEREFORE, THE YAMHILL COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance 540 is hereby repealed.

Section 2. This ordinance being necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Yamhill County, and an

emergency having been declared to exist, shall become effective immediately upon passage.




