THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF YAMHILL COUNTY, OREGON (the Board) sat for the transaction of county business in formal session on June 21, 2012, Commissioners Leslie Lewis, Kathy George, and Mary P. Stern being present.

WHEREAS, in 1987 the Board adopted Ordinance 423 establishing the Public Land Corner Preservation fund; and

WHEREAS, on May 29, 1989, the Board adopted Ordinance 485 which increased the fee charged on documents recorded pursuant to ORS 205.130(2) from \$6 to \$10 per document; and

WHEREAS, for the past 25 years, many of the corners originally established by the General Land Office and perpetuated by County Surveyors during the past one hundred and fifty years have been restored using the Public Land Corner Preservation Fund; and

WHEREAS, the County Surveyor recently completed a three year program using the Corner Preservation Fund to acquire geodetic coordinates on all existing monumented Public Land Corners in Yamhill County, and

WHEREAS, the County Surveyor has recommended that the fee charged pursuant to Ordinance 485 be reduced from the current \$10 amount to \$5 per document to permit the continued maintenance of these public land corner survey markers; and a duly noticed public hearing was held June 14, 2012, when the Surveyor spoke in favor of this fee reduction, and no party spoke in opposition. Now, therefore;

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Public Land Corner Preservation Fee is hereby reduced from \$10 to \$5 per document recorded in the office of the Yamhill County Clerk pursuant to ORS 205.130(2).

Section 2. Except as amended by Section 1 above, the remainder of Ordinances 423 and 485 shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. This ordinance being necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Yamhill County, shall become effective on July 1, 2012.
